MISSION

The Oregon Clinic Foundation supports local non-profits to advance health and equity.





ABOUT

The Oregon Clinic Foundation was formed as an opportunity for our physicians, practitioners, and team members to extend our care and support beyond the clinic walls to create lasting, meaningful change in our community. By providing grants to small, local non-profits, we are helping to directly address the root causes of health disparities—limited access to healthcare, implicit bias, racism, social inequities, and housing challenges.



2025

The TOC Foundation grants awarded in 2025 support a broad range of work including:

- Funding the Artist Mentorship Program’s efforts to serve over 17,000 meals annually and supply food to youth facing extreme food insecurity.
- Increasing the Returning Veterans Project’s Volunteer Health Provider network by 25+ through recruitment, training, and support activities.
- Helping Clay Street Table launch a weekly multicultural pantry, including the physical build and a tailored nutrition/recipe program.





2025 ACHIEVEMENTS

- We raised a total of \$79,350 while increasing our donor base, allowing us to maintain our grantmaking capacity in 2026.
- Completed three grant cycles with funding released in March, July, and December 2025.
- Highlighted the vital work of Foundation-supported non-profits by showcasing their grants in action on the Foundation webpage.
- Launched a quarterly newsletter for donors.
- Launched an internal employee awareness campaign on The Oregon Clinic's intranet sharing how Foundation grants are directly impacting communities where we live and work.
- Coordinated fundraising appeals to secure grant capacity for 2026.
- Enhanced our relationship with grantee organizations by coordinating volunteering activities through The Oregon Clinic Community Benefit Committee.
- **Embrace Compassion Farm Day Volunteer Event:** Over 60 team members, family, and friends from across The Oregon Clinic spent a Sunday volunteering at Embrace Compassion's beautiful farm in Sherwood, Oregon. Volunteers helped with many different activities, including harvesting fruits and vegetables, planting, weed whacking, and more.
- **With Love Oregon Holiday Toy Drive:** During the first Oregon Clinic-wide coordinated toy drive, team members donated close to 1,000 toys for children in foster care in the Portland Metro area. Enthusiastic and creative Toy Drive Champions at over 30 TOC clinics led efforts to encourage participation and made the toy drive a success.



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For more than 45 years, David’s Harp has served as a trusted, community-based resource in East Portland. Founded in response to the closure of major psychiatric hospitals, we offer a warm, non-institutional environment where members participate in therapeutic and skill-building activities that support mental stability, independence, and meaningful connection. In 2025, David’s Harp team of five clinical and peer support staff provided a total of 2,919 mental health services to 95 program members. We are grateful for The Oregon Clinic’s investment in our work, which has strengthened our community, expanded opportunities for connection, and helped build healthier, more stable lives for adults living with severe mental illness in our state. 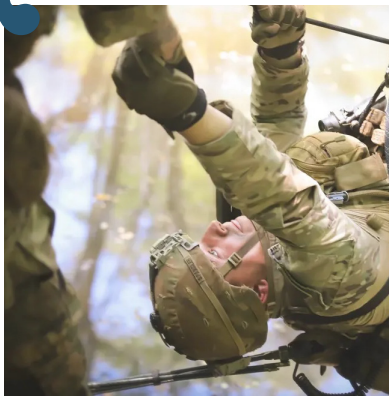
